Stories from the Past


Then the Society first formed one and a half years ago and we were tossing around ideas for committees, one that quickly surfaced was Oral History. I have to admit that, at that time, I did not place a great deal of importance on this area. I have since come to realize that this is probably the most important and exciting project that we have undertaken.

By videotaping the interviews with early pioneers and long time residents of our area, we can relive history and record for posterity the wonderful stories of the past. The telling and sharing of stories strengthens communities by "making people feel more connected to each other and the place where they live," according to the California Council for the Humanities.

Our Oral History committee is headed up by Alex Wilson, who has a vast amount of experience and skill in the realm of videos. She and her committee members have already interviewed several residents and have a long list of people to be interviewed in the future. These videos are also being transcribed in manuscript form. Another goal is to create a documentary film or use excerpts of the videos as a feature in our future museum.

o many wonderful things come across my desk each day that it's hard to choose one over the other to write about. For instance, the Society was given a ledger, written in a lovely handwriting that only years of practice in a school primer could produce.

"The newly organized branch of the San Jacinto & Hemet Valley P.T.A. of the 23rd. Dist. at Idyllwild was held Wed. Oct. 24, 1934 at the Idyllwild School house."

The word house caught my interest so I went thru my files, pleased when I found the photograph of the one room house and the young children lined up in front. I thought to myself how lucky we are today that they took the time to capture that moment.

Carefully turning the yellowed pages, my eyes savoring the dips, swirls and flowing script written so long ago, I was stopped by the list of officers names: Johnson, Humphreys, Meeker, Nagel, Westcott, Hogue, Belden, Wendelken, Jolly, Teeple, Patton, Wassell, Morris and the popular Mr. and Mrs. Drummond who came to Idyllwild right after their honeymoon to teach at the school house in the mid 30's.

The names jumped from the pages, grabbing my attention, seducing me to read on. These family names have been my reading material for weeks now, as I've researched the 30's, 40's and 50's.

Suddenly a long ago time comes to life from the beautifully hand written and carefully kept pages of the ledger...

"Mrs. Belden told of her plans for a penny carnival"

"A bill for 29 cents for a Secretary's ledger and a stamp was presented"

"A motion to spend 21 cents on Easter eggs was made and accepted"

"Mrs. Drummond reported on the Penny May Carnival"

"A report of the P.T.A. Float was made by Mrs. Johnson. The float was decorated to present a Woodland scene. The front of the truck represented summer and the back winter. Four children dressed to represent the winter and summer sports rode on the truck."

And now I will share something with you from the year 2002, I love what I do – volunteering to be curator!

Memories of Idyllwild, c.1903-05, by Serena Bland Prensser

Mrs. Orin Knowlton (Anita) and I, Serena Bland Prensser, spent three days in this beauty spot. This glorified Paradise still retains the general topography and aroma of cedar, pines and ferns that I enjoyed 1903-5 inclusive (summers, I mean).

Anita and I drove up in my rejuvenated (new engine, etc.) 1936 Chevrolet and stayed from Tuesday to Thursday with Mr. & Mrs. Casebeer in their delightful woodsy cottage that is amazingly modern, rustic and completely comfortable and charming all at the same time.

There are now several thousand people here in summer and at least 1500 in the winter months as against a couple of hundred in the summer and less than a hundred in the winter at that time.

Whereas, yesterday, we drove up a wide, easy macadamized grade with a line down the center, when we came up here, 45 years ago, we rode in a surrey-like stage with four or six horses (I can't remember which) and drove galloping up the last few hundred feet to the lodge with the whip cracking and the horses galloping and came to a sudden, glorious full stop at the "Bungalow". At the lodge was the office, a large hardwood floor dance hall, a beautiful cobblestone fireplace and a huge dinning-room.

We slept in large tents on a platform several steps from the ground with privacy controlled by the sheet-like curtains strung on wires. Outside, each tent enjoyed wide burlap "sag seats" and a curving fire-place about 3 feet high, 5 feet wide and 2 or 3 feet deep at the center, made of huge cobblestones.

Our very dear friend, the late Chas. E. Green, owned the stables. His wife, Claire, was our very dearest friend, my sister's friend, who had lived at our home before her marriage. (She passed on recently, too.)

We made all the trips there were to make on horse-back, including the 3-day trip to San Jacinto Peak, camping two nights in a half-shelter tent with our clothes on at Tamarack Meadows.

We looked down on Palm Springs through the lovely canyon above it. Palm Springs then consisted of a couple of Palms Trees only at the time.

From San Jacinto Peak we looked into three states, Idyllwild has a very real part in my memories.


