THEY WERE KEEN ON OUR MOUNTAINS!

Our beloved Strawberry Valley hasn't always been the main tourist attraction in the San Jacinto Mountains. Between 1915 and 1924 the Idyllwild Inn had strong, and at times superior, competition from Tahquitz Lodge, located six miles down the Hill at Keen Camp.

While Idyllwild tended to draw from the coastal cities, Inland Empire residents actually preferred Tahquitz Lodge. It was a bit quieter, more rustic, and easier to get to. And it attracted a steady stream of movie crews, after Cecil B. DeMille discovered its

usefulness for scenes in his (and Hollywood's) first feature film, "The Squaw Man."

Keen Camp is dimly remembered today, its name preserved at the nearby summit on Highway 74. But it once designated a resort and settlement at the site now occupied by the Living Free animal sanctuary.

John and Mary Keen were two experienced hotel owners running the Florida Hotel at Valle Vista (then called "Florida"), when San Diego County in 1888 opened the original toll road between Hemet and Strawberry Valley for free public use. The resulting flood of summer visitors to the valley lured the Keens, as well. In 1890 they bought pioneer logger Amasa Saunders's cabin at the site of today's Idyllwild Elementary School. Christening it the "Keen House," during the next decade they expanded it into a precursor of 20th-century motels as it became the valley's premier

lodging.

By 1901 the Keen House was doomed by the scale and elegance of new hotel facilities at the Idyllwild Sanatorium. So the Keens bought a ranch on the old Mayberry Road to Lake Hemet in 1905, set up a campground named Keen Camp, and had their buildings in Idyllwild disassembled and reused as material for new cabins and a modest lodge.

The Keens retired in 1911 and sold the camp and lodge to Percy and Anita Walker, a ranching couple from Sage. Within a year Percy met a tragic end, drowning in Lake Hemet while trying to rescue a capsized fisherman. Anita carried on by teaching at Kenworthy School in Garner Valley, where she lived with her two daughters during the week, then opening Keen Camp to weekend guests.

In 1914 widowed Anita hired Robert Elliot to manage the lodge, which promptly burned down.


Undaunted, the two married and rebuilt a grander facility they named Tahquitz Lodge. 1914 was also the year DeMille arrived. The lodge's resurrection and DeMille's publicity brought the resort into its golden age.

Tahquitz Lodge had all the amenities: tennis courts, swimming pool, stables, comfortable cabins, and reputedly the largest ballroom

in Riverside County. Renowned photographer Stephen Willard publicized it with picture postcards he created after his 1917 stay. (Elliotts changed the spelling to "Tauquitz" after 1920, believing it closer to Cahuilla pronunciation, only to restore the "h" by 1937, consistent with other area landmarks.) The lodge became more popular than Idyllwild among Inland Empire residents

In 1924 the Elliott family sold the resort to a group of Los Angeles businessmen, who turned it into a private club. The deal bogged down for six years in lawsuits over payments and title issues. Anita Walker Elliott caught pneumonia at Tahquitz Lodge and died shortly before the court returned property to her family.

Robert reopened the resort in 1930, managed by Anita's daughter Alyce Walker Murphy, but while it

could still attract 500 people for special dance dates, its day had passed. In foreclosure by 1942, the final blow, with a sale already in progress, was a 1943

wildfire. Propelled by a Santa Ana gale, the fire first raced past Keen Camp on both sides, sparing the lodge. But when the wind shifted, the flames reversed direction and returned to raze the nearly entire resort, sparing only the general store and the lodge's swimming pool.

A year later the Pasadena YWCA bought the scorched property, which became Tahquitz Meadows summer camp. The Keen Camp post office was relocated to a newly populated, nearby settlement and renamed "Mountain Center." In 1980, Emily Jo Beard acquired the defunct camp for Living Free.



About the authors JOHN DRAKE & REBECCA FRAZIER are

freelance photographers and videographers who first picked up cameras in their early teens and had both been coming to Idyllwild with their families since they were young children. They realized their similar interests and love of the mountain community while returning from a first date in Idyllwild. As adults they took the opportunity to move from San Francisco and take residence in the Drake family cabin in 2001.


In 2006, they sought to use their years of digital and reprographic experience by volunteering for the Idyllwild Area Historical Society, just as IAHS was undertaking digitization of its collection of tapes, video, documents and photos. They continue to provide media consultation as well as the design and photography for the society's major annual event, the Idyllwild Home Tour.

Since 2007, they have combined their talents and experience as the photographic team FrazierDrake. They blog their photos and experiences to their website, Myldyllwild.org, as well as showcasing artists and all things Idyllwild.

ROBERT B. SMITH has been visiting annually or residing full-time in the San Jacinto Mountains since 1939. He has volunteered for the Idyllwild Area Historical Society as its treasurer, archive supervisor, and newsletter co-editor, along with research and writing. For six years he wrote a monthly history column for the local newspaper, and this is his third book on the San Jacinto Mountains.

Smith's professional career before retirement was as a chemistry professor, college dean, and university provost. Along the way he has been a prize-winning nature writer and an op-ed columnist on science, environment, health, and education.

Bob and Adele Smith, long-time supporters of IAHS are leaving the hill to relocate in Hemet.

Bob's enchantment of the San Jacintos began with yearly childhood visits after the Moote family, his grandparents, acquired "Pinewood" in 1925. After many summer visits together, Adele also fell under Idyllwild's spell. Upon retiring, Bob and Adele fulfilled their dream of enjoying alpenglow sunsets and life on the "Hill," by moving to Idyllwild.

Administrator, archivist, hiker, historian, scientist and writer, Bob Smith is well known to Idyllwild. Bob's background includes past years as a scientist and administrator, then after moving to Idyllwild in 2001, IAHS archivist and historian. As a writer of note, he submitted monthly historical columns to the Town Crier newspaper, and authored two successful books *Idyllwild and the High San Jacintos*, and *Idyllwild Through Time* (a collaboration with Frazier/Drake).

Bob supported IAHS by serving on the board of directors, working many years as treasurer, and as a popular guest speaker and archivist, spreading his historian's expertise of the Idyllwild area. Adele Smith has shared the years with Bob, as companion, copy editor, and supporter, while also acquiring artifacts for IAHS. They are a magnificent team.

Thank you Bob and Adele. May the alpenglow remain with you in fond memories of our forested mountains and village. We will definitely miss you.
