
Preserving the History of Idyllwild and Neighboring Communities in the San Jacinto Mountains

The Cole Family Legacy

In November 2000, Becky Clark, Idyllwild Town Crier editor, handed me a copy of a letter written to her by Phyllis Marling of South Pasadena. Mrs. Marling asked someone from the newly formed Idyllwild Area Historical Society "to get in touch with me" as she

wanted to join. (Phyllis is the niece of early settler, Lee Emerson,). That initial contact led to a treasure trove of photos and stories of Idyllwild's early days. Phyllis shared some wonderful memories of going to dances at the Idyllwild Inn and other memorable events. She also put me in touch with her good friend, Louise Cole Campbell who resides in Santa Barbara.

Last spring Louise started mailing us the most incredible letters containing detailed information about her family's life in Idyllwild starting with the 1920's and continuing

through each decade up to the present. The Cole family cabin on River Road, built in 1917, and acquired by Frances and A.W. Cole in 1922, is still owned by this family.

Delightful photographs accompanied the letters making her stories come alive. Anecdotes about neighbors and

other Idyllwild families who were friends of the Coles also add to the historical importance of these accounts.

Bobsledding, snowshoeing on rented snowshoes from the Inn, hiking, dressing up for the annual Masquerade Ball, riding the *Haywire* wagon to summer barbeques at Whisnand's Barn, searching for lost golf balls in the wild rose bushes at the golf course, with her brother Vic, and swimming in the pool at the clubhouse were just a few of the activities that young Louise engaged in when coming from Long Beach to Idyllwild.

For the next several months, Louise continued to send wonderful letters chronicling her family's life at the cabin. What an incredible wealth of information about a very fascinating time in our history. We are so grateful that Louise took the time to share with our Society these invaluable recollections.

A Smashing Success... Harvest Home Tour 2002!





Garner Valley Members Come To The Rescue!


long time ago (possibly around the turn of the century) a little wooden building at Keen Camp, Mountain Center, was erected to house a blacksmith shop and tack room. Over the years it has withstood wind storms, fires and several repairs, as often happens with "working buildings", but it never lost its charm. It even became a 'movie star'!

Back in the 30's and 40's many westerns were filmed at Keen Camp and Garner Valley because of the natural beauty of the valley and surrounding backdrop of mountains. The script for *Take me Back to Oklahoma* starring Tex Ritter called for a blacksmith shop and so

this little wooden building, that sat patiently doing its intended work over the years, was called on to star in a Hollywood movie.


It came to the attention of the Historical Society that it would be torn down and people felt saddened that a part of our history would be lost forever. After many planning meetings were held and restoration experts were sought for advice, four members of the Garner Valley Equestrian Club and several Garner Valley home owners came to the rescue!

In the last few weeks, they have carefully and lovingly dismantled, transported and stored this historic structure that will later be erected on our Museum site as a ranch farm building, and the home for Garner Valley ranching artifacts.




Keen Camp Blacksmith Shop.

An Old Friend Returns...

riginally published from 1967 to 1984, *The High Country* journal was revived in 2002 to share stories with a new generation of High Country residents. The founders were Elsinore newspaperman Tom Hudson, Sam Hicks, the manager of Erle Stanley Gardner's Rancho Paisano, Al Newhart, an insurance salesman turned author, (and uncle of comedian Bob Newhart), freelance writer Bill Cox, Parker Kimball, and Temecula historian Horace Parker, with Ralph Love.

Today's *High Country* is published by the Temecula Valley Museum as a part of its on-going efforts to share the history of this area with residents and visitors alike.

We are very pleased to announced that an article submitted by the IAHS was accepted for this issue. *Memories of "Desert Steve" Ragsdale* written by Harry Quinn, was originally presented as a talk given by Harry at our annual general meeting on October 12, 2001.


